Step 1


Download our app  (OMC) from one of the following:

Step 2

Open OMC and find your library's OverDrive-powered website. In newer versions of the app, you can do this by swiping from left to right to open the **Home menu**, then tapping **+** Add a library. In older versions of the app, tap the  icon (or, if you don't have this icon, go to *Menu > Get Books*).





